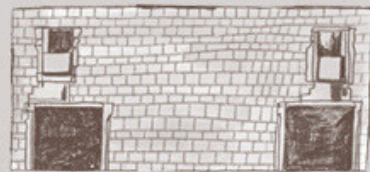

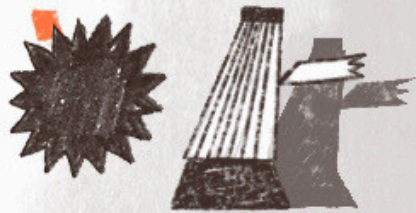

- From Rye Train Station, exit walking left, heading through the long station car park, before exiting left again onto Rope Walk. You'll walk over the train crossing onto The Grove and past a school. Continue left onto Love Lane walking along until you reach a gate and a rough track on the left of Rolvendene Farm at the end; take this track all the way. Look out for the High Weald Landscape Trail sign on the gate (HWLT)
- Continue across the field, keeping the River Tillingham on your left. You'll cross over the river on a small bridge and continue on to the next field. While walking through the fields, you may be able to spot Leasam House on the hill away to your right.
- After about 20 minutes, you'll reach a field with a little corrugated iron barn; continue past this onto the brick Red Barn ahead on the hill straight before you. Keep heading up the hill!
- You're over halfway there, so turn around to enjoy the view! Continue on the rough track past the brick Red Barn, and keep going as you pass Clayton Farm and Cherry Barn on your right, where the rough track widens to become more of a rough road, lined with trees.
- This rough road eventually meets up with Church Lane; turn left here, and you'll see St Peter & St Paul's, a Saxon age church on your right. Keep walking down Church Lane, with Peasmarsh Place over a hedge on your right, before forking left onto Dew Lane. Keep on to where this lane turns right to become Starvecrow Lane, where you'll spot our own Tillingham sign, while you continue on Dew Lane. You're nearly there!
- Continue on down Dew Lane until you see a final Tillingham sign, then straight on to the final lane up to Tillingham Winery.

We recommend using a walking app such as Footpath route planner on the Apple store to keep you on the right track!
